Enclosed find my monthly report. Note the change of address. I have been transferred to the 135th. Med. Group, APO 74. I was transferred because they discovered that I was past 45 summers old and that this was an army of young men and not one of old men, so here I am. I like the work fine. It is still combat stuff but more travel via jeep. Have a number of units which I must visit, say Mass for or arragne that Mass is said for them. Father Lt. Col. Anselm Keefe, A Norbertine Father of De Pere Wisc. is going home on T.D. and I am taking his place.
