Occupation is going very peacefully. Almost every Jap man or boy has a uniform, in whole or in part. The men look rather stolidly at one, some smile, bow and salute. Many children have learned "Hello" and "Cigarette". They loudly cheer the G I's who are good to them. They take very well to the colored troops.

We are quartered in a Nippon Carbon Factory, but will move to a tent area soon. Yokohama had one 3-hour raid by 600 planes dropping five bombs; damage was terrific. 2 of the four Catholic churches were destroyed. There were about 5,000 Catholics in this city of 700,000.
