Dear Father Bob:

The UPI box is on the way - finally found a box fit for the Father Chas. E. Coughlin Social Justice National Weekly newspapers and put them in date order.

It appears Fr. Coughlin founded the weekly March, 1936, and that his radio work at the Nectory, Royal Oak, Michigan, Shrime of the Little Flower, began a few years earlier according to a few Fr. Coughlin booklet sermons 1932-1933 also enclosed.

Un Uctober 16, 1939, when World War II was brewing, a new Radio censored Code of National Association of Broadcasters took affect and included commentators Fr. Coughlin, Dorothy Thompson, Boake Carter, Edwin C. Hill, Lowell Thomas, E.J. Cameron, H.V. Kaltenborn, Gen. Hugh Johnson on NBS, CBS and Mutual Broadcasting systems. Some years later I remember seeing in the paper that Father Coughlin died but do not remember the year. The history this man was publishing is what is interesting - I believe he was at Jewuit schools - now people are fussing just like back in those years, 1930's, minus the War of course.
