History of the DBQ Ferries, RR, and Ice Harbor JC GREG F-11

Articles from the 1850’s about the ferries owned by Charles Hipolyte and his son, Charles Henry, which ran across the Mississippi River between Dunleith, IL and Dubuque, IA and also up the Mississippi River; articles about the Illinois Central Railroad bridge which replaced the ferries, and an article about the sale of the Dubuque Ice Harbor

1. 1851 newspaper article of a notice from the Land Office concerning the reserved land for the railroad.
2. 1853 newspaper article ‘Improvement in Railroads’ with handwritten notation “New Rail Road”.
3. 1855 newspaper article referring to the letter from Geo. W. Jones respecting the alleged infringements by the Illinois Central Railroad Company.
4. 1855 list of city improvements including expenditures of the Harbor Companies.
5. 1856 newspaper article listing the various fees charged for the ferry running between Dubuque and Dunleith.
6. “Genl Jones’ letter, Ill. C. RR.”: Jan. 7, 1856 newspaper article which is a copy of a letter from Geo. W. Jones detailing the injurious practices of the Railroad Co. to Dubuque Co., favoring Dunleith, Il. The article states that the Railroad Co. should construct a railroad bridge to Dubuque.

7. 1856 newspaper article which is a copy of the Center Island Contract in which the city of Dubuque sold the Ice Harbor area to Jesse P. Farley, Franklin V. Goodrich, Austin J. Goss, Robert C. Waples, Christopher Pelan, Frederick E. Bissell, Robert M. Walmsley and Alexander Anderson for the purpose of filling in the sloughs, improving the levees and extending the streets.
