& polite. No trouble at all. They carry out
our military orders & the letter. I haven't
found Fr. Joe Weber yet. Haven't run into
any of the other fathers yet. The weather
here is delightfully cool. Much like Iowa
Sept. - frost in ^{the} morning. Trees are coloring.
We notice our blood is getting thin for this
climate. Will soon get woolens.
