They go to the sacraments well and are tickled to have a priest. They are not shy either in approaching the priest. The officials there cooperate well too. In fact there was a battle on to keep me there full time but the hospital won half time.

I heard the sad news of the Archbishop's Sister's death. I wish you would extend to him my sympathies. I will remember her in my Mass and prayers.
