List Factors Affecting Religious Work: We have men here for a period of thirteen weeks for their basic training; hence we only introduce these recruits to their religious duties in the service. The trainees are too busy to spend much time with chaplains, or for chaplains to spend much of their time.

General Remarks: For the sake of "eye wash", we have quite an empire of chaplains built up here, including four Catholics. Two of us could do the work, except for Sunday Masses, thus releasing two for bases without priests.
