at will. Once in a while a Filipino  
pony wanders in. Holy Thursday morn-  
ing, he was practically with me at the  
altar, when I came to the last  
Gospel.

A Fr. Masonte of Sacramento, Calif.  
had me help him Holy Thur. evening  
and brod Trin. for the Fr Arc; 14  
sermons - on the 14 Stations.

What a delight to run into Fr.  
John Kessler, who chanced into  
the chapel just while I was there.  
Many Indigne archdiocese boys on our  
ship.
