

Further remarks:-

The prisoners should have a chapel. I have asked for one. Plans are set in motion for a chapel.

About 40 % of the group are Catholic. 45 % of Luthern Faith and the remaining 5% have no faith at all.

The Catholics - about 50 % attend Mass regularly. Of the non-Catholics - about 20 % attend but has been dropping off at times. Have no real Luthern Chaplain available for them.

There is urgent need for full time Cathlic Chaplain. As stated in last months report. I was sent here as the resident Chaplain. But due to the attitude of the 8th. Service Command Headquarters and at Camp Fannin I was transferred to the Station Hospital, Cp. Fannin with added duty - P.W.Cp.

Many of the German Catholics who do not attend I believe could be brought back with a resident Catholic Chaplain and through his personal contact with them. As it is my time is limited to 5 afternoons and evenings a week.

The Cathlics are appreciative of what is being done for them. They have built an altar, a tabernacle, and a confessional. I have furnished them with musical instruments, wind, string organ and piano; also the sheet music. Also Church Music for High Mass and Benediction and devotions.

I would say that 25 % of confesions were from 3 to 5 years ago. Which I heard at Christmas time. Most of the men were in battle areas from 3 to 5 years.

I have set down these added remarks in hope that they would be of interest and help to your office
